



# What is an Identification Placement and Review Committee (IPRC)?

Regulation 181/98 requires that all school boards have set up an IPRC.

- Each KCDSB school has an IPRC
- Minimum 3 board personnel,
- **Must include a principal** or supervisory officer (designate) of the board

#### KCDSB IPRC Members

- 1. Student's principal (or designate)
- 2. Student's learning resource teacher
- 3. Student's regular classroom teacher

## What is the Role of the IPRC?

### The IPRC will:

- Decide whether a student should be <u>Identified</u> as an <u>Exceptional pupil</u>\*, according to the criteria established by the Ministry of Education and KCDSB
- Determine the student's <u>Placement\*</u> decision for students deemed exceptional





## Range of **Placement** Options the IPRC may consider in making its placement decision:

A regular class with indirect support	A regular class with resource assistance	A regular class with withdrawal assistance	A regular class with partial integrations	A special education class full time
The student is placed in a regular class for the entire day, and the teacher receives specialized consultative services.	The student is placed in the regular class for most or all of the day and receives specialized instruction, individually or in a small group, within the regular classroom from a qualified special education teacher.	The student is placed in the regular class and receives instruction outside of the classroom for less than 50 per cent of the school day, from a qualified special education teacher.	The student is placed by the IPRC in a special education class*, for at least 50 per cent of the school day, but is integrated with a regular class for at least one instructional period daily.	The student is placed by the IPRC in a special education class*for the entire school day.

## What is an Individual Education Plan (IEP)?

Must be developed in consultation with parents/guardians, students age 16+ including:

- Descriptions of the student's strengths and needs
- Specific educational expectations
- Special education programs and services that will be received
- Methods by which progress will be reviewed;
- Transition Plan
- Completion within 30 days after Placement in the Program
- Copy of IEP given to parents & student (age 16+)



## The IPRC Process and Procedures: Initiating the IPRC

**Principal refers** student to the IPRC by **request of parent** or **their own** initiative

### The **parent**:

- Makes this request in writing to the principal
- May request accessibleformat communication




# The IPRC Process and Procedures: Responding to the IPRC Referral

IPRC Chair (Principal) gives the parent (& student age 16+) written notice of

- The date, time and location of the meeting, and
- A copy of KCDSB's A
   Parent's Guide to Special

   Education





With written consent, the Committee obtains reports or assessment to inform their Identification & Placement considerations.



## IPRC Process and Procedures: The IPRC Meeting

#### The IPRC:

- -Decides whether to identify the student as exceptional by applying the categories and definitions of Exceptionalities given by the Ministry
- Describes the **Strengths & Needs** of the student
- Decides on the **Placement** of the student
- Sends written notice of decision (the "IPRC Decision Form" to parents, student (age 16+), Special Education Coordinator and the Director of Education.



# The IPRC Process and Procedures: Implementing the IPRC Decision

The parent/student age 16+:

- Agrees to the statement decision\*, or
- Take no action\*
- May (within 15 days) **request a 2**<sup>nd</sup> **IPRC meeting** or notice of appeal to the board (30 days)
- \*The IPRC decision is implemented and an IEP must be developed (within 30 days)



## Identification, Placement, and Review Committee

### **Annual Review**

- Minimum once every school year, IPRC reviews student's identification and/or placement
- 3 months after placement has begun, parent may request an IPRC review. (A review cannot be requested more than once every 3 months)
- Parent may agree in writing **to dispense with** or waive **the annual review**
- \*The same steps apply to the IPRC Review as the Initial IPRC meeting.

#### IPRC PROCESS

#### Learning Need Identified

Noticing that there is a learning need to be met, by a teacher, student, or parent



Students can access special education services without going through the IPRC process, or while waiting for an IPRC meeting

#### Collect and Share Information

Examples may include: psychoeducational assessments (when possible), medical reports, report cards, and parent and/or student logs

Share in advance. if possible and appropriate

#### IPRC Request

Make a written request to the Principal

Within 15 days, written notice of approximate date of the IPRC meeting and the school board's guide to special education must be provided

#### IPRC Meeting

Review of information and discussion about needs

People at the meeting:

- Three or more school staff, including Principal and/or Superintendent
- Parent, student 16+
- · Family support (optional)



There is an annual IPRC review, to ensure that the identification/

placement are still appropriate



Full-time special education class

- Learning goals and expectations
- Accommodations
- Modifications




